After serving as Senior Tribal Policy Advisor for the U.S. Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, Marilyn returned to the NNCTC in 2016 as Senior Director of Policy and Programs. A pioneer in the facilitation of trauma-informed tribal system change, Marilyn has provided expert testimony to Congress and been appointed to numerous national task forces, including the Attorney General's Advisory Committee on American Indian/Alaska Native Children Exposed to Violence.
