THE IMPACT OF COLOR-EVASIVE PRACTICES IN ADOPTION

JaeRan Kim, Ph.D., MSW, (she/hers) is an Associate Professor in the School of Social Work and Criminal Justice at the University of Washington at Tacoma, located on the traditional territories of the Puyallup tribe. Prior to completing her doctoral degree, she worked with foster and adopted children and families and with adults with disabilities in residential care.

Dr. Kim's research is focused on the well-being of adoptees, exploring race, disability, and transnational experiences for adoptees. Her research includes the racial, ethnic, and adoption socialization practices of Korean American adoptee parents, out-of-home care (residential treatment, group homes, and foster care) for adoptees, and adult intercountry adoptees with adoption displacement experiences. Dr. Kim's research also explores the preparation and training of professional social workers.
